To either of the Constables of the Town of Middlefield

Greetings:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town, qualified to vote in Elections and Town affairs, to meet in the Middlefield Elementary School in said Middlefield on Saturday, the twelfth day of February next, at 11:45 in the forenoon then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

Art. 1. To choose on one ballot a Moderator, Treasurer, Auditor, Tree Warden, and Finance Committee member for a term of one year:

A Constable, a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals; and two members for the Planning Board for a term of two years:

A Selectman, Assessor, Trustee of Public Library, Cemetery Commissioner, A member of the Zoning Board of Appeals, and a member of the Gateway Regional School Committee for a term of three years; and two members for the Planning Board and two members of the Finance Committee for a term of three years.

The polls will open at 12:00 M.and will be closed at 5:00 o'clock P.M. The Business meeting will start at 1:30 P.M.

Art. 2. To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurer, School Committee and Tax Collector and act thereon.

Art. 3. To determine the disposition of the Dog Fund.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the revenue for the financial years beginning January 1, 1972 and January 1, 1973 in accordance with the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17, or take any other action thereto.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$74,652.02 for the Gateway Regional School for 1972.

Art. 6. To determine the manner of repairing the highways and bridges and pass any vote in relation to same.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury, the sum of 3,800.00 for Chapter 90 Highway Construction, said money to be used in conjunction with State or County funds or both.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury a sum of \$615.00 for Chapter 81 Mainenance, said money to be used in conjunction with State or County funds or both.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury, a sum of \$3,100.00 for Chapter 90 Maintenance, said money to be used in conjunction with State or County funds or both.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,500.00 from the Machinery Earnings account to the Machinery Expense account.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the salaries of Elective Town Officers and to determine the amount of salary for each Elective Officer.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to refund fees due tax collector collected from taxes and tax titles; 1969 taxes \$52.00; 1970 taxes \$22.00; and tax titles, \$18.00, \$6.00, and \$33.00. Total \$131.00.

Art. 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Other articles may be added to this warrant.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting attested copies of the same in the Town Post Office, on the bulletin board at the Elementary School and in a designated place in the Bancroft section of the Town, seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereol, fail not, and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk at or before the time of holding said meeting.

We have just signed a new lease for the disposal area and we ask for the cooperation of all residents in keeping the area clean and using the facilities properly. Improper use of the dump can terminate our lease and then become a costly problem.

REPORT OF THE MIDDLEFIELD PUBLIC LIBRARY

During 1971 the Town appropriated \$95.00 for the library, but there was no money from the Dog Tax Fund and no state grant, due to the fact that Middlefield was ineligible for direct state aid. The requirement, according to the General Laws, Ch. 760 sec. 19A, Acts of 1960, as amended by Ch.636, Acts of 1970 is as follows:

"No city or town which appropriates for its full library service in any year, an amount less than six dollars per capita of population shall receive any money under this section, if such appropriation is below the average of its appropriation for full library service for the four years immediately preceding."

During 1971 expenses were paid from the balance in the library account.

This year we were assisted by Mrs. Julia Andersen and Beth Doane, with the library open $10\frac{1}{2}$ hours per week, with one hour in the evening. Mrs. Andersen has continued to take charge of the work with the State Bookmobile and contacted them for special requests from our readers.

Our circulation from the Town library was 637 books. The State Bookmobile reported that they had loaned us 5404 books, making a total of 6041 books read during the year.

During the winter months there are no regular library hours because our library is without heat and light. However, anyone needing books may contact the librarian or Mrs. Andersen, who will try to fill requests from our library, or through the State Bookmobile or the Interlibrary Loan.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

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The year 1971 marked the completion of the Mobile Home by-law and its legalization by the Attorney General. This was the culmination of a number of years of study, planning, research and a good deal of frustration. During the final stages of preparation the community participated actively. The Taxpayers Association mailed out to all voters a fact sheet with what they felt were the pros and cons of Mobile Homes. The open hearing was well attended and the discussion active. The final vote had a large turn out and the final by-law represented the decision of a well informed, interested electorate.

The Starbuck Memorial Playground plans have been formalized and a carved wooden plaque will be hung and a tree representing a living memorial will be planted with an appropriate ceremony in the Spring of 1972. The Planning Board would appreciate suggestions and help in planning and completing the much needed refurbishment of the playground.

The official town survey map has been mounted and awaits final hanging in the school. We hope that this location will prove convenient for use by all.

The Planning Board has had several membership changes and office replacements during the year. Helen Cook chaired the board for most of the year with Carol Varsano serving as secretary. When Helen Cook resigned for health reasons, Lois Stein became chairman with Richard Bellows assuming the office of secretary. Jessie Hartley, an active member, resigned for personal reasons and Ann Jewett was appointed to fill her term. The resignation of Helen Cook as chairman left the board sorely missing her knowledge, experience and diligent leadership.

For the coming year the board will look into minimum acreage for the Agricultural, Residential district and possible ways for updateing and enlarging the existing Building Code. A long range master town plan in co-ordination with state planning is an ongoing project.

The board as a whole would like to extend to the town residents an invitation to join with us either at the meetings or through contact with individual members to give us your ideas as to other directions you would like us to pursue.
