#### TOWN WARRANT

#### COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

Hampshire, SS.

To either of the Constables of the Town of Middlefield

Greetings:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town, qualified to vote in Elections and Town affairs, to meet in the Middlefield Elementary School in said Middlefield on Saturday, the third day of May, next at 11:45 in the forenoon then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose on one ballot a Town Clerk, Moderator, Auditor, Tree Warden and Finance Committee member for a term of one year.

A Selectman, Assessor, Trustee of Public Library, Treasurer, School Committee member, two Constables, two Finance Committee members, two Planning Board members, Cemetery Commissioner and a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals for a term of three years.

A Planning Board member for a term of two years.

The polls will open at 12:00 P.M. and may be closed at 5:00 o'clock P.M. The business meeting will start at 1:30 o'clock P.M.

Art. 2. To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurer, School Committee and Tax Collector and act thereon.

Art. 3. To determine the disposition of the Dog Fund.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of revenue of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1980 in accordance with the provision of the General Laws, Chapter 14, Section 4, and to issue a note or notes therefor, payable witin one year and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with General Laws, Chapter 4, Section 17.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, the sum of \$89,175.90 for Middlefield's share of the budget for the Gateway Regional School District for the period of July 1, 1979 through June 30, 1980 or take any other action thereto, or accept as a net assessment a sum which is less than \$89,175.90 as certified by the Gateway Regional school District. Art. 6. To determine the manner of repairing the highways and bridges and pass any vote in relation to same.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury a sum of \$16,000.00 for maintenance of Town Highways.

Art. 7A. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury, a sum of \$7,500.00 for oiling roads.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treausry, a sum of \$10,000.00 for the Machinery Expense Account.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the salaries of Elected Town Officers and to determine the amount of salary for each Elective Officer.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury a sum not to exceed \$13,000.00 to cover all Town Insurance.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Reserve Fund.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Hinsdale Ambulance Fund and \$500.00 for the Huntington Lions Club Ambulance Fund or take any other action relating thereto.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vot to accept the 1980 State Aid Grant of \$501.00 from the Massachusetts Bureau of Library Extension and to deposit it in the Middlefield Library Fund.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$350.00 from the Library Fund to the Library Account.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to continue the restoration needed on the oldest of the Town records or to begin the microfilming of the Town Record Books which are the legal accounts of the Town meetings.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury the sum of \$620.00 for the Lee Visiting Nurses Association.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury the sum of \$1,750.00 for payment of firehouse note.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treausry the sum of \$1,750.00 for interest on the fire house note.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury the sum of \$5,000.00 for loan payment on truck or take any other action relating thereto.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury the sum of \$1,050.00 for interest on the truck loan.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treausry a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 for an underground 1000 gallon tank and pump for diesel fuel for town equipment or take any other action relating thereto

Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for rubbish disposal.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to exempt \$8,000.00 of free cash from the provisions of Section 12A of Chapter 151 of the Acts of 1979 and that such free cash not be utilized for the purpose of reducing the property tax levy for fiscal 1981.

Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept Chapter 282, Section 57A, Acts of 1979 of the General Laws which provides for penalty on bad checks tendered in payment of a tax. Penalty shall be 1% of check or \$5.00 whichever is greater.

Art. 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from unappropriated funds in the Treasury a sum not to exceed \$2,500.00 for a new garage door to replace the old fire house door or take any other action relating thereto.

Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to increase the appropriations limit established by Chapter 151 of the Acts of 1979 by \$15,460.79 so that the appropriations limit as so increased will be \$101,550.29.

Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote to increase the levy limit extablished by Chapter 151 of the Acts of 1979, by not more than \$ so that the levy limit as so increased will not be more than \$

Art. 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Other articles may be added to this warrant.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting attested copies of same in the Town Post Office, on the bulletin board at the Elementary School and in a designated place in the Bancroft section of the Town, seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereof, fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk at or before the time of holding said meeting.

January 18, 1979 - Twelve voters (a quorum) were present

It was unanimously voted to transfer from unappropriated funds in the treasury the sum of \$522.21 to the Salt Shed Account. The shed was larger than anticipated.

It was unanimously voted to transfer from unappropriated funds in the treasury the sum of \$300.00 to the Inspection Account (Building, Plumbing and Wiring). The Selectmen reported that the fees charged by the various inspectors must first be paid to the Town and then paid to the inspectors. This is to comply with accounting practices expected by the State Auditors.

It was unanimously voted to transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury the sum of \$87.58 to the File Cabinet Account. This completes the payment on the new insulated file cabinet, the price of which had risen from the time of ordering.

A discussion of the railings under the arch bridge in Bancroft was generated by Edmund Kurtz. No motions were made but the Selectmen are aware of the concern of the people travelling that road. The bridge discussion also included a lengthy discussion of the sudden closing of the Chester bridge on January 16 and the inconvenience to everyone, including the school bus drivers.

March 6, 1979 - Twelve voters (a quorum) were present

It was unanimously voted to transfer the sum of \$8,000.00 from unappropriated available funds in the treasury to the Town Snow Account.

It was unanimously voted to transfer the sum of \$2,500.00 from the Highway Oiling Account to the Town Highway Account.

It was unanimously voted to transfer the following sums to the Machinery Expense Account:

> \$766.00 from the Anti-recession Fiscal Assistance Program \$185.96 from the Revenue Sharing Account \$729.22 from the Machinery Earnings Account

The Town Clerk read her letter to the Selectmen outling the State Senate's Ethics Committee's move to write full financial disclosure statues to apply to the officials of small towns and cities. The Selectmen and the voters present agreed that a petition be made for elected officials to sign indicating their disagreement with the proposed laws. A similar one, to be signed by the general voters in Middlefield, was also thought to be a good idea and it was moved that the Town Clerk prepare such documents. They are to be sent to our State Senator and Representative.

#### July 17, 1979 - Forty voters were present

It was voted unanimously to approve a sum of money not to exceed \$35,000.00 for a new firehouse to be financed by a loan from Farmers Home Administration at 5% to be paid back in twenty annual installments.

Ann Jewett asked that the meeting recognize the fine performance of the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Volunteer Fire Department in a recent muster.

#### November 29, 1979 - Nineteen voters were present

It was voted unanimously to transfer a sum not to exceed \$4,000.00 from unappropriated available funds to the Firehouse Account to cover unforeseen expenses involved in the construction of the new firehouse.

Voted unanimously to purchase a used four-wheel drive truck and wing for a sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 to be financed as follows:

(1) Transfer \$5,000.00 from Revenue Sharing Account to the Machinery Purchase Account.

(2) \$15,000.00 to be financed by a note, or notes, payable in three years, with interest. VOTE: YES:18 - NO:None

#### REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

During the past year the Finance Committee has gone through an almost total replacement of members. Chairman Bruce Nunn moved out of town and other members found it difficult to get together until the past few months.

The vacancies have been filled through appointments by the Selectmen. We have been actively meeting with the Selectmen and reviewing the budget for the upcoming year. The budget as presented in the Town Report was mutually agreed upon by the Finance Committee and the Selectmen.

Because of our inexperience in town government and with each other, we were unable to develop other recommendations for this report. We plan to be at the town meeting and available for questions at any time.

### REPORT OF THE MIDDLEFIELD PUBLIC LIBRARY

The past year has been marked by continued efforts to improve the status of the library and to extend its services to the community. Many new books have been added through purchases and gifts. The librarian has completed the last of three courses in library management and book selection, thus enabling the library to be in a more favorable position to receive a larger state grant in 1980-1981. The amount of the state grant may also be determined by the outcome of the present campaign to increase state aid to libraries. In 1979, the bill received a pocket veto from Governor King, but a new bill has been submitted which may provide more funds in 1980-1981. The Bookmobile schedule has been severely curtailed and few new books have been purchased by the Western Regional Library.

During the past year 802 books from the local library and 1535 from the Bookmobile were circulated. The Bookmobile continues to render a valuable service to the community. Mrs. Julia Y. Andersen has aided in contacting the Bookmobile office in Pittsfield for special requests and in notifying residents of the dates of the Bookmobile visits. She has also volunteered her services in assisting the librarian.

Other used equipment purchased included: 1½" hose-2½" hose-Forestry hose-Extinguishers-Nozzles. A cellar pump and a rescue sled were purchased by the Fireman's Association. The portable generators are also in working order.

Many of the Firemen attended training sessions given last year including:

Pump Operations class given by Mass. Firefighting Academy. Operation of the new Ford by Hinsdale Fire Dept. Mutual Aid drill with the Hinsdale and Dalton Departments and the area Fire Co-ordinator.

The year was not all work however, during the summer the department, Ladies' Auxiliary and Muster Team marched in several area parades. One of these was the Cummington Bi-Centennial where we placed second. The Muster Team showed that they too are to be reckoned with in the coming years, with good performances at the Hinsdale and Chester Fireman's Musters.

Again this year a vote of thanks to the Ladies' Auxiliary. Their purchases of radios for the trucks, materials for the new station and an 80 cup coffee maker along with their tremendous support, has been a great asset to the department. We're looking forward to working side by side with them in the coming years.

### REPORT OF THE AMBULANCE FUND

A meeting of the Selectmen and both the Huntington Lions' Club, and the Hinsdale Fire Dept. Assoc. ambulance services was held on Wednesday, March 5th to discuss ambulance coverage, and the opportunity of budget funds to help sustain the service.

It was decided that people living in the Village, and oriented towards the Berkshire Medical Center, should be directed towards the Hinsdale Ambulance.

Those living on the East River Road, and in the easterly end of town, and oriented towards Noble Hospital, would be directed towards the Lion's Club Ambulance.

Both ambulance services wish to restrict their calls to an emergency nature, and are not staffed to handle simple transport jobs, such as - nursing home to hospital, etc.

A <u>special</u> transport job that might be handled by either Hinsdale or Huntington Lion's Club <u>could be</u> set up, providing there was a positive need for it, and proper arrangements could be made, well in advance.

The trained members of the Fire Department would act as firstresponders in a local emergency, and call on the appropriate ambulance service.

Both Huntington and Hinsdale will cover for each other, in case their equipment is tied up, and an emergency arises.

Since Hinsdale covers about two-thirds of the calls, and Huntington Lion's, one-third, we recommend that the budget figure for ambulance coverage be apportioned the same way.
